Program Requirements

Establishing candidacy is required for all certificate students. Domestic students may take up to five courses before establishing candidacy. International students must establish candidacy prior to starting the program, and must complete a minimum of 12 units per quarter.

In order to earn the Interior Design: Foundation Level certificate, all 18 courses must be completed with a recorded letter grade. The pass/no pass grading option is not permitted. A minimum GPA of 2.0 must be earned in order to fulfill the certificate requirement. In order to be considered for the Master of Interior Architecture degree program, a minimum GPA of 3.0 must be earned. Bachelor's degree required.
